# Simple Sentence Cards

The dog in ball catches while he watches.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect word order.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> The dog catches the ball while he watches</p>
We eat in the kitchen when it has rained.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect placement of the complement.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> We eat in the kitchen when it rains</p>
She waits when the bus arrives her.	<p><b>Error:</b> Subject and pronoun not aligned.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> She waits when the bus arrives for her</p>
I do my homework after you go play.	<p><b>Error:</b> Conjunction not used.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> I do my homework before you go play outside.</p>
The cat that is hungry is tired because it is.	<p><b>Error:</b> Absence of punctuation and confusion of ideas.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> The cat is tired because it is hungry.</p>
She runs while her brother walks.	<p><b>Error:</b> Pronoun misalignment and word order.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> She runs while her brother walks</p>
We watch the film during that we eat popcorn.	<p><b>Error:</b> Verb and tense agreement error.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> We watch the film while we eat popcorn.</p>
The children to play outside while the parents are tired.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect conjunction choice.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> The children play outside while the parents rest.</p>

When she speaks loudly on the phone.	<p><b>Error:</b> Absence of punctuation to mark the sentence end.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> When she speaks loudly, she is on the phone.</p>
It's nice outside but I stay home because outside there is wind.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect use of conjunction.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> It is nice outside, but I stay home because there is wind.</p>
We will go on foot to the cinema when it rains because we will be soaked.	<p><b>Error:</b> Conjunctions incorrectly used to express consequence.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> We will go to the cinema on foot even if it rains, although we might get soaked.</p>
Before he works in the garden the rain falls.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect conjunction and pronoun.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> He works in the garden before the rain falls.</p>
She stayed at home if she was tired.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect use of the conjunction "if".</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> She stayed at home because she was tired.</p>
We have eaten while we were thirsty.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect conjunction used.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> We ate while we were hungry.</p>
I left because it was cold when I had not taken my coat.	<p><b>Error:</b> Incorrect conjunction and word order.</p> <p><b>Corrected:</b> I left because it was cold and I hadn't taken my coat.</p>



# Quick Reference Guide: Common Sentence Corrections

Use this guide to help identify and correct common errors in sentence structure. If you're unsure about a sentence, check here for examples and tips!

## Word Order Errors

- **Explanation:** The sequence of words in a sentence affects clarity and meaning. A clear sentence typically follows this order: **subject – verb – object**.
- **Incorrect Sentence:** “The dog in ball catches while he watches.”
- **Corrected Sentence:** “The dog catches the ball while he watches.”

**Tip:** Ask yourself, “Who is doing the action, and what are they doing?” Ensure the subject and verb come first, followed by additional details.

## Conjunction Errors

- **Explanation:** Conjunctions link ideas in a sentence. Using the right conjunction helps clarify relationships, like cause, time, or contrast.
- **Incorrect Sentence:** “She stayed at home if she was tired.”
- **Corrected Sentence:** “She stayed at home because she was tired.”

**Tip:** Test different conjunctions (e.g., *because*, *although*, *when*) to see which one best connects the ideas logically.

## Punctuation Errors

- **Explanation:** Punctuation marks (commas, periods) separate ideas and clarify meaning. Without punctuation, sentences can be confusing or misleading.
- **Incorrect Sentence:** “Before he works in the garden the rain falls.”
- **Corrected Sentence:** “Before he works in the garden, the rain falls.”

**Tip:** Look for places where ideas shift, and add commas or periods to separate them.

## Subject-Verb Agreement Errors

- **Explanation:** The verb in a sentence must match the subject in number (singular/plural).
- **Incorrect Sentence:** “I eat dinner before we goes play outside.”
- **Corrected Sentence:** “I eat dinner before we go play outside.”

**Tip:** Check that the verb matches the subject. Say the sentence out loud—does it sound right?

## Misplaced Modifiers

- **Explanation:** Modifiers (descriptive words or phrases) should be placed close to the words they describe.
- **Incorrect Sentence:** “We watched the movie while eating popcorn on the couch.”
- **Corrected Sentence:** “While eating popcorn, we watched the movie on the couch.”

**Tip:** Make sure descriptive phrases are next to the word or idea they modify.

**Refer to these tips as needed, and keep moving through the maze as you correct each sentence!**
