



Verb Tense Chart

(Past, Present, Present Continuous, Future)

Verb (Base Form)	Past Tense	Simple Present	Present Continuous (right now)	Future Tense
eat	ate	eat	am eating	will eat
play	played	play	am playing	will play
walk	walked	walk	am walking	will walk
write	wrote	write	am writing	will write
see	saw	see	am seeing	will see
run	ran	run	am running	will run
talk	talked	talk	am talking	will talk
drink	drank	drink	am drinking	will drink
jump	jumped	jump	am jumping	will jump
read	read (pronounced "red")	read	am reading	will read
swim	swam	swim	am swimming	will swim
sing	sang	sing	am singing	will sing

How to Use:

1. **Print and provide** this verb tense chart to students so they can refer to it when writing sentences for each of the four tenses.
2. The chart shows both regular and irregular verbs to help students understand how verbs change in different tenses.



Sample Sentences for Each Tense

Past Tense:

“Yesterday, I ran to the park and played with my dog.”

“This morning, I ate my breakfast.”

Simple Present:

“Every day, I eat breakfast at 8 a.m.”

“I play soccer after school.”

Present Continuous:

“Right now, I am sitting at my desk, writing about my day.”

“I am playing outside with my friends.”

Future Tense:

“Later today, I will visit my grandmother.”

“Tomorrow, I will go to the zoo.”




