You receive a surprise gift from your best friend. You discover a new planet through your telescope. You walk into a room full of balloons for a surprise party.

You ride a roller coaster for the first time.

You find a secret door in your house that leads to a hidden room!

You bake your first cake, and it turns out perfectly!

You see a dolphin jumping out of the water at the beach.

You score the winning goal in a soccer game!

You open a mysterious letter with a secret message inside.

You find a \$100 bill on the ground while walking home.

You get a high score on your favourite video game!

You finish a huge puzzle that took you all day to complete.

How to Use These Cards:

- 1. **Print and cut out** the scenario cards. Place them at the centre so students can pick one.
- 2. Students will read their chosen scenario and write 2-3 exclamatory sentences reacting to it.

How to Use These Expanded Illustration Cards:

- 1. Print and cut out these illustration cards.
- **2.** Students will choose an illustration and write 2–3 exclamatory sentences based on the emotion the image evokes.
 - Example (Anger): A child angrily stomping away from a broken toy:
 - "Oh no! My favourite toy is broken!"
 - "I can't believe it's ruined!"
 - Example (Fear): A child stuck in a tree:
 - "Help! I'm going to fall!"
 - "I'm so scared"

Here are **Sentence Starters** for the **Exclamatory Sentences** literacy centre, categorized by different emotions to help students get started based on the scenarios or illustrations they select:
