Advanced Level:

Story 7: A Visit to Grandma's House

last weekend we visited grandma's house we helped her bake cookies and played in her garden do you like visiting your grandparents grandma told us stories from when she was young we had a wonderful time

Story 8: A Snowy Adventure

this winter we had a lot of snow my family built a big snowman have you ever built a snowman we also went sledding down the hill it was so much fun until we got too cold

Story 9: The Mystery of the Lost Key

one day i lost the key to my house it was very small and silver we looked everywhere in the garden and inside the house do you know where it might be finally we found it under the couch what a relief

How to Use:

- 1. Basic Level: Stories 1–3 are simple, with fewer sentences and basic punctuation errors.
- 2. Intermediate Level: Stories 4–6 introduce longer sentences and more varied punctuation, requiring more attention to detail.
- **3.** Advanced Level: Stories 7–9 present slightly longer narratives with more sentences to correct, adding complexity for students who need an additional challenge.

I went to the store, but I forgot to buy bread. I got eggs instead.

14. Front:

my family went to the mountains last summer we hiked and camped Back:

My family went to the mountains last summer. We hiked and camped.

15. Front:

i love to read books but sometimes i watch movies instead Back:

I love to read books, but sometimes I watch movies instead.

How to Use:

- 1. Print and cut out the sentence cards.
- 2. Shuffle the cards and place them in a stack for the game.
- **3.** Players will draw a card, correct the sentence, and compare their answer with the correct version on the back.

How to Use:

- 1. Round Columns: Each player records their points for each round by filling in the corresponding column (e.g., Round 1, Round 2, etc.). Each correctly fixed sentence earns 1 point; if any mistakes are missed, they receive 0 points or a penalty if desired.
- **2. Total Score:** After completing all rounds, players total their points in the **Total Score** column to determine the winner.
- **3. Optional:** You can add **bonus points** for particularly tricky corrections or creativity in creating sentences using the dice variation.
