Card 1

Scenario:

You are walking through a forest and hear a noise. Do you...

- Choice A: Follow the noise?
- Choice B: Hide behind a tree?
- Sentence Starter A: I decided to follow the noise because...
- Sentence Starter B: I decided to hide behind a tree because...

Card 2

Scenario:

You see a river blocking your path. Do you...

- Choice A: Build a raft to cross the river?
- Choice B: Look for a bridge?
- Sentence Starter A: I decided to build a raft so...
- Sentence Starter B: I looked for a bridge because...

Card 3

Scenario:

A dog approaches you, barking loudly. Do you...

- Choice A: Run away?
- Choice B: Try to calm the dog?
- Sentence Starter A: I ran away when...
- Sentence Starter B: I tried to calm the dog because...

Scenario:

You find a locked door with a mysterious key nearby. Do you...

- Choice A: Try the key in the lock?
- Choice B: Look for another way around?
- Sentence Starter A: I tried the key in the lock because...
- Sentence Starter B: I looked for another way around when...

Card 5

Scenario:

You discover a treasure chest in the cave. Do you...

- Choice A: Open the chest immediately?
- Choice B: Wait and check for traps first?
- Sentence Starter A: I opened the chest when...
- Sentence Starter B: I waited to check for traps because...

Card 6

Scenario:

You find yourself lost in a maze. Do you...

- Choice A: Turn left at the next corner?
- Choice B: Keep walking straight?
- Sentence Starter A: I turned left so...
- Sentence Starter B: I kept walking straight because...

Scenario:

There's a storm approaching and you are far from shelter. Do you...

- Choice A: Head for the nearby village?
- Choice B: Look for a cave to hide in?
- Sentence Starter A: I headed for the village because...
- Sentence Starter B: I looked for a cave when...

Card 8

Scenario:

You find a strange glowing object in the grass. Do you...

- Choice A: Pick it up?
- Choice B: Leave it alone and walk away?
- Sentence Starter A: I picked it up so...
- Sentence Starter B: I left it alone because...

Card 9

Scenario:

You hear someone calling your name from far away. Do you...

- Choice A: Go toward the voice to find out what they want?
- Choice B: Ignore the voice and keep walking?
- Sentence Starter A: I decided to go toward the voice to find out what...
- Sentence Starter B: I ignored the voice because...

Scenario:

You want to go outside to play, but the sky looks stormy. Do you...

- Choice A: Wait until the storm passes?
- Choice B: Go outside unless it starts raining?
- Sentence Starter A: I decided to wait until the storm passed because...
- Sentence Starter B: I will play outside unless...

Card 11

Scenario:

You see two paths in the forest. Do you...

- Choice A: Take the path on the left?
- Choice B: Take the path on the right?
- Sentence Starter A: I decided to take the left path because...
- Sentence Starter B: I took the right path but...

Card 12

Scenario:

You are invited to two different parties. Do you...

- Choice A: Go to the first party?
- Choice B: Go to the second party?
- Sentence Starter A: I went to the first party and...
- Sentence Starter B: I decided to go to the second party or...

Scenario:

You are sitting by a lake watching the sunset. Do you...

- Choice A: Stay for a while longer to watch the stars?
- Choice B: Leave before it gets too dark?
- Sentence Starter A: I stayed for a while...
- Sentence Starter B: I left before...

How to Use:

- 1. Print and cut out the adventure cards.
- 2. Each card presents students with a decision and two possible paths. They must choose one and use the sentence starter to explain their choice by completing the sentence with a conjunction like *when*, *so*, or *because*.

Conjunctions Chart

Conjunction	How It's Used	Example
when	To show time or a specific moment	"I go to the park when it's sunny."
SO	To show a result or consequence	"It was raining, so we stayed inside."
because	To give a reason	"I brought my umbrella because it looked cloudy."
if	To show a condition or possibility	"We will go to the zoo if it stops raining."
although	To show contrast between two ideas	"Although I was tired, I still finished my homework."
before	To show something that happens earlier	"We ate lunch before we went to the museum."
after	To show something that happens later	"I did my homework after I got home."
and	To join similar ideas together	"I have a cat and a dog."
but	To show a contrast between ideas	"I wanted to play outside, but it started raining."
or	To present choices	"We can have pizza or pasta for dinner."
while	To show two things happening at the same time	"I was reading while my sister was cooking."
what	To introduce a clause (used in questions or explanations)	"She told me what she likes."
unless	To show a condition or exception	"You can't go to the park unless you finish your homework."

Beginning of the Journey

How to Play:

1. Step 1: Start the Journey

Students begin at the **Start Point** and draw the first card. They write their sentence and choose the path based on the conjunction they used (e.g., "I went left because I heard a sound"). They then move to the next step.

2. Step 2: Move Along the Path

They repeat the process at each step by drawing a new card, or using a conjunction, and moving along the map—the choices they make with conjunctions like **because**, **so**, or **when** lead them forward.

3. Step 3: Reach the Final Step

- After 13 steps, students reach the end of the map.
- Final Reflection Activity: Describe your adventure using at least three conjunctions to summarize the key moments in your journey.
