


# Picnic Shopping List (Singular Nouns)

### Shopping List (Singular)



### **Plural Rules Chart**



Rule	Example
1. Add -s to most nouns	apple → apples
2. Add -es to nouns ending in -ch,-sh, -s,-x, or -z	sandwich <b>→</b> sandwiches box <b>→</b> boxes
3. Change - y to -ies for nouns ending in consonant + y	baby → babies
4. Add -s for vowels before -y	toy 🔿 toys
5. Some nouns change completely (irregular plurals)	child <b>-&gt;</b> children mouse <b>-&gt;</b> mice
6. Add-es to nouns ending in -o (when they follow a consonant)	tomato 🔶 tomatoes potato 🔶 potatoes
7. Add -s to nouns ending in -o (when they follow a vowel)	radio 🔶 radios video 🔶 videos
8. Some nouns have the same singular and plural forms	sheep → sheep fish → fish

#### How to Use:

- 1. **Print and place** the plural rules chart at the centre so students can refer to it while transforming singular nouns into plural forms.
- 2. Encourage students to follow these rules when converting their picnic shopping list from singular to plural.
