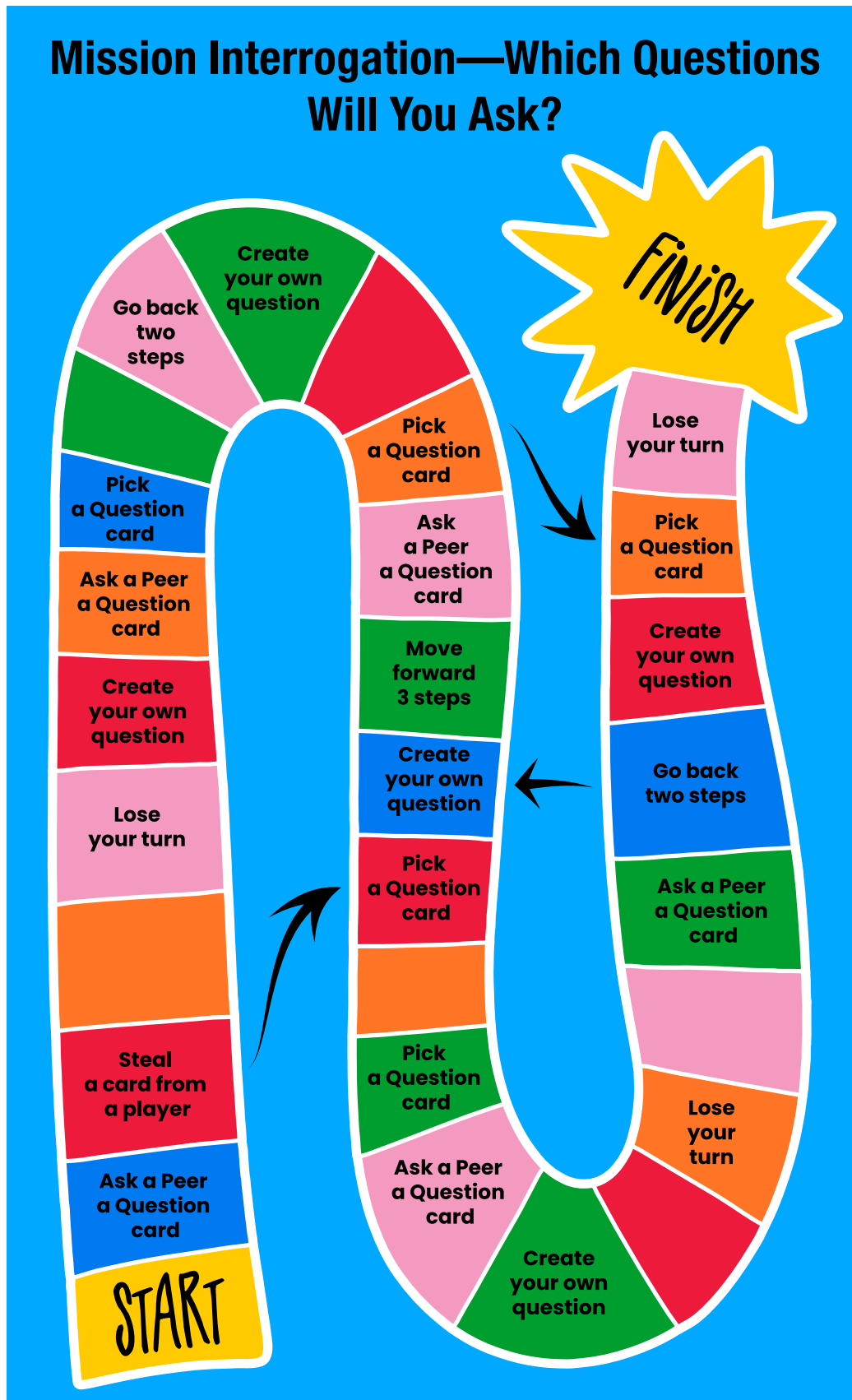
Welcome to the Question Challenge!

Question	Answer
Where does the cat sleep?	The cat sleeps on the couch.
Who is your best friend?	My best friend is Sarah.
What did you eat for lunch?	I ate a sandwich for lunch.
Why is the sky blue?	The sky is blue because of the way light works.
How does a bird fly?	Birds fly by flapping their wings.
When is your birthday?	My birthday is in May.
Where do fish live?	Fish live in water.
Who helps you at school?	The teacher helps me at school.
What is your favourite colour?	My favourite colour is red.
Why do we need to sleep?	We need to sleep to rest our bodies.

Question	Answer
How do you ride a bike?	You ride a bike by pedalling.
When do you wake up in the morning?	I wake up at 7 in the morning.
Where is the library in your school?	The library is near the office.
Who likes to play soccer with you?	My brother likes to play soccer with me.
What is your favourite game?	My favourite game is tag.
Why do plants need water?	Plants need water to grow.
How does the sun rise?	The sun rises because the Earth rotates.
When does the school day end?	The school day ends at 3 p.m.
Where do you go to buy food?	I go to the grocery store to buy food.
Who teaches your class?	My teacher is Ms. Green.
