Treasure Hunt Adventure

Scenario:

"You and your friends are exploring the forest when you find an old, torn treasure map! It promises to lead you to hidden treasure. Along the way, you encounter traps, clues, and surprises. What happens next? Use all types of sentences to tell the story!"

Planning a Surprise Party

Scenario:

"You are planning a surprise birthday party for your best friend, Marty. Things are not going as planned! It's a disaster! The cake falls, the decorations blow away, and the guests are late. How do you save the day? Write the story using all types of sentences."

The Mysterious Space Mission

Scenario:

"You are an astronaut on a mission to explore a mysterious new planet. Your spaceship lands on a new planet. Suddenly, something goes wrong! Strange creatures appear, and your supplies are running out. How do you solve the problems? Use all types of sentences to tell your adventure."









The Lost Pet

Scenario:

"Your pet goes missing, and you and your friends set out to find it. You follow clues, ask neighbours, and face challenges along the way. Will you find your pet? Write the story using all types of sentences to describe your journey."

The Great School Race

Scenario:

"It's the day of the big school race, and you are determined to win! But there are challenges: the weather changes, other runners are fast, and the course is tricky. How do you make it to the finish line? Use all types of sentences to tell your story."

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The Magic Book

Scenario:

"In the library, you discover a magic book that can bring stories to life! When you open it, characters jump out of the pages, causing chaos. How do you handle the situation? Use all types of sentences to describe your adventure with the magic book."



The Haunted House Mystery

Scenario:

"You and your friends are excited to explore a haunted house in your neighbourhood. As you walk inside, strange noises, creaky floors, and spooky shadows greet you. What mysteries do you uncover? Write the story using all types of sentences."

The Weather Disaster

Scenario:

"You're enjoying a sunny day at the beach when suddenly the weather turns for the worse—a massive storm is coming! How do you stay safe, and what happens next? Use all types of sentences to tell your adventure."



The Zoo Escape

Scenario:

"During a school trip to the zoo, the animals somehow escape from their enclosures! It's up to you and your friends to help the zookeepers round up the animals. How do you handle this wild situation? Write the story using all types of sentences."



The Secret Treehouse

Scenario:

"You and your friends discover a hidden treehouse in the woods; inside it, you find strange objects and clues. But who built the treehouse? And what secrets does it hold? Use all types of sentences to tell the story of your discovery."

The Time Machine Adventure

Scenario:

"You and your friends discover a hidden time machine in your backyard! You accidentally press a button, and the machine takes you to a different time period. Where do you end up, and how do you get back home? Use all types of sentences to tell the story of your adventure through time."

The Superhero Mission

Scenario:

"You suddenly discover that you have superpowers! You and your friends must use your new abilities to save the city from a mysterious villain. What challenges do you face, and how do you use your powers to defeat the villain? Use all types of sentences to describe your superhero mission."

How to Use These Scenario Cards:

- 1. Print and cut out these scenario cards.
- 2. Students will pick one scenario to base their story on.
- 3. In their story, they must include at least one example of a **simple sentence**, **compound sentence**, **interrogative sentence**, **exclamatory sentence**, and **imperative sentence**.







Sentence Type Checklist

Sentence Type	Example	Check When Used
Simple Sentence	"The map is old."	
Compound Sentence	"We followed the map, <i>but</i> it led to a dead end."	
Interrogative Sentence	"Where is the treasure?"	
Exclamatory Sentence	"Wow! This is amazing!"	
Imperative Sentence	"Dig here!"	

How to Use the Checklist:

- 1. Print and distribute the checklist to each student.
- 2. As students write their stories, they will refer to the checklist to ensure they've included all the required sentence types.
- 3. Students will check off each box when they successfully use a simple, compound, interrogative, exclamatory, or imperative sentence in their story.

Example Sentences for Each Type

Sentence Type	Example
Simple Sentence	"The map is old."
Compound Sentence	"We followed the map, <i>but</i> it led to a dead end."
Interrogative Sentence	"Where is the treasure?"
Exclamatory Sentence	"Ouch! This really hurts!"
Imperative Sentence	"Dig here!"
